Year 13 – Law bursaries

Carey Olsen Law bursary is primarily designed for students who are either studying law or about to embark on a professional legal qualification. In exceptional circumstances, we will also consider undergraduates who are keen to study law at a later stage. Students should possess excellent personal and academic skills. As well as receiving financial assistance while studying, in the form of a term-time grant, you will be offered up to eight weeks of relevant and engaging paid employment throughout the year. These placements take place in all legal teams in the firm to provide a rounded experience of legal practice.

Please note that we cannot consider applicants who are in receipt of any other employer funded bursary payments.

Year 11 & 12 – Morrisby

If your son is not sure about what he would like to do after his A Levels, I would highly recommend that he sits the Morrisby profile test. This helps to focus the boys attention on the possibilities and alternatives available and is supported by UCAS, the Universities & Colleges Admissions Service. It is a computer-assisted programme, which not only seeks to match the prospective candidate's abilities and interests with

A Level courses, but also those on offer at Higher Education institutions on the mainland. In addition, it matches which career would most suit a student.

The participant is required to complete an online assessment measuring their reasoning skills, general abilities, and their practical abilities. The objective is to give an overall picture of the student's strengths and capabilities. Thereafter they will receive a profile listing the areas which seem to interest them the most, together with a list of A Levels and courses which could be appropriate. An action plan for individual decision-making and a number of websites to help in the research of the courses is also suggested. These suggestions do not necessarily provide all the answers, but they are an excellent starting point. If your son decides to take up this opportunity, he will have a login for life. This means that students can go back and investigate different options over time and Morrisby will be there to support them at all of the important educational and career decisions throughout their lives.

We believe very strongly in the worth of the programme and hope that all boys will take advantage of it. If you would like your son to be entered for Morrisby, please let Mrs Job, Head of Careers & Assistant to the Head of Sixth Form know, together with confirmation that you have sent a bank transfer for £25.00 to Sort code 40-25-34, Account 31237632 – clearly marked with your son's name and 'MORRISBY'. The profile will then be completed one lunchtime or at home. I do hope that you will discuss the scheme with your son and in particular the final report, when it arrives. I believe it to be a useful means of focusing attention on the important choices to be made in the very near future.

Applications are invited by 31st May 2024 by email (or post, if preferred) for these prestigious awards from boys and girls from HMC schools for gap year projects for 2024-2025. The Trustees have agreed that up to 30 scholarships may be awarded of between £200 and £800.

Candidates need to fulfill the following criteria and applications must follow headings listed on the website:

- 1. <u>The benefit to the community of the country/countries where work is undertaken during the gap year</u> <u>project.</u> The majority of awards go to boys and girls involved in projects in poorer countries or in the poorer areas of other countries.
- 2. <u>The suitability of the organisation of the project in terms of duration and the gap organisation</u> <u>involved, if there is one.</u> The project must be of sufficient length to give real benefit to a community. The Trustees usually expect that the project will be at least for three months, unless there are special circumstances.
- **3.** <u>Financial need</u>, assessed from the report from the Head, the statements in the application and the breakdown of expenses and methods of raising money in the application form.
- **4.** <u>Suitable character and promise</u>, assessed from the quality of the written application and the reference of the Head of the school.

Award winners have to write to the Administrator during their project, write a report for the Trustees at the end of their project and return to their school to talk to the Sixth Form about their experiences.
