Subject	Details of Assessment
Maths Edexcel	For Higher tiers (Edexcel): Paper 1 - Non-Calculator Paper 2 - Calculator Paper 3 - Calculator These will be past papers and any topic could appear on any paper. This will be the best way to prepare for a real exam.
English Language Edexcel	Full Paper 2 – 2hrs 15 mins Section A asks students to read two non-fiction text and then answer a series of 8 questions testing their skills of information retrieval, analysis and evaluation. Section B is a transactional writing task. Students are given two tasks to choose from. They will be tested on their ability to write in a specific form: newspaper / speech / review / letter.
English Literature Edexcel	Full Paper 1 – 1 hr 45 mins Section A – Two questions to complete on their chosen Shakespeare text (will only be up until where studied): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Shakespeare Extract – analysis - Shakespeare wider – discussion of whole text including context Section B – A choice of two questions on Lord of the Flies. Students will answer on the whole text and need to discuss context in their response Full Paper 2 – 1 hr 45 minutes Section A – Two questions to complete on Jekyll and Hyde: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - J&H Extract – analysis - J&H wider – discussion of whole text Section B – Two questions to complete on poetry <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Anthology comparison – will be given one poem they have been taught and will need to compare it with their choice of another – analytical skills + context
RE AQA	One paper of 1hr 45 mins. This will be a Themes paper. This will include a 1, 2, 4, 5 and 12 mark question on each of: Relationships; War and Peace; Religion and Society; Crime and Punishment.
French AQA	Reading paper Higher (1 hour) / Foundation (45 mins) Listening paper Higher (45 mins)/Foundation (35 mins) Venue TBC Writing paper Higher (1hour 15m) / Foundation (1 hour) Entire course will be assessed. Speaking mocks will take place mid-March.
Spanish AQA	Reading paper Higher (1 hour) / Foundation (45 mins) Listening paper Higher (45 mins)/Foundation (35 mins) Venue TBC Writing paper Higher (1hour 15m) / Foundation (1 hour) Entire course will be assessed. Speaking mocks will take place at the end of March.
Biology CAIE	Written Paper – 2 hour Mixture of multiple choice and written answers. All chapters assessed up to, and including, Reproduction.
Chemistry CAIE	Multiple Choice Paper (Paper 2) – 45 mins Written Paper (Paper 4) – 1 hour 15 mins Alternative to Practical Paper (Paper 6) – 1 hour The entire course will be assessed except for syllabus sections 4.2 Hydrogen-oxygen <i>Fuel Cells</i> , 8.3 <i>Group VII Properties</i> and 6.3 – <i>Reversible Reactions and Equilibrium</i> . Syllabus and student learner guides are available in the “Examination Documentation” folder in the Year 11 Chemistry Student section on SharePoint. You are assessed on both the core AND extended topics on the syllabus
Physics CAIE	Multiple Choice Paper (Extended - Paper 2)– 45 mins Written Paper (Extended - Paper 4) – 1 hour 15 mins The entire Cambridge IGCSE course will be assessed <i>(a few boys may have been specifically told that they are doing Core versions of these papers)</i>

Drama CAIE	<p>Written Examination Paper 1 (2hrs 30 mins) 0994 Spec. Pre-released study text 'Sorting Out Rachel' and 'Hanjo' Sections A and C.</p> <p>Section A – Eight questions, totalling 30 Marks Section C – Two questions totalling 25 Marks, 10 mark and a 15-mark split.</p> <p>Lessons are now being used for the revision, but students are advised to study the pre-released text to prepare for Section A and to also complete extension homework's set between these lessons based on their devised pieces ready for Section C. All students have been offered intervention sessions on Tuesday lunchtimes for additional preparation for this exam.</p>

When completed, this piece of work will be added to your Course Work Unit. This completed Unit represents 60% of your GCSE mark.</p>
