Subject	Details of Assessment
Maths	<p>For Higher tiers (Edexcel):</p> <p>Paper 1 - Non-Calculator Paper 2 - Calculator Paper 3 - Calculator</p> <p>These will be past papers and any topic could appear on any paper. This will be the best way to prepare for a real exam.</p> <p>Foundation – Completing a REAL Foundation iGCSE paper on 10th and 17th Jan</p>
English Language	<p>Full Paper 2 – 2hrs 5 mins</p> <p>Section A asks students to read two non-fiction text and then answer a series of 8 questions testing their skills of information retrieval, analysis and evaluation.</p> <p>Section B is a transactional writing task. Students are given two tasks to choose from. They will be tested on their ability to write in a specific form: newspaper / speech / review / letter.</p>
English Literature	<p>Full Paper 1 – 1 hr 45 mins</p> <p>Section A – Two questions to complete on their chosen Shakespeare text:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Shakespeare Extract – analysis - Shakespeare wider – discussion of whole text including context <p>Section B – A choice of two questions on Lord of the Flies. Students will answer on the whole text and need to discuss context in their response</p> <p>Full Paper 2 - 2 hrs 15 mins</p> <p>Section A – Two questions to complete on Jekyll and Hyde:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - J&H Extract – analysis - J&H wider – discussion of whole text <p>Section B – Two questions to complete on poetry</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Anthology comparison – Texts will be given one poem they have been taught and will need to compare it with their choice of another – analytical skills + context - Unseen Poetry – Students will be given two poems they have not seen before and will need to write a comparative analysis
RE (Short Course)	<p>One paper of 1hr 45 mins.</p> <p>This will include a 1, 2, 4, 5 and 12 mark question on each of: Christianity; Buddhism; Relationships; War and Peace.</p>
French	<p>Reading paper Higher (1 hour) / Foundation (45 mins)</p> <p>Listening paper Higher (45 mins)/Foundation (35 mins) conducted in Le B classrooms</p> <p>Writing paper Higher (1hour 15m) / Foundation (1 hour)</p> <p>Entire course will be assessed. Speaking mocks will take place mid-March.</p>
Spanish	<p>Reading paper Higher (1 hour) / Foundation (45 mins)</p> <p>Listening paper Higher (45 mins)/Foundation (35 mins) conducted in Le B classrooms</p> <p>Writing paper Higher (1hour 15m) / Foundation (1 hour)</p> <p>Entire course will be assessed. Speaking mocks will take place in mid-March.</p>
Biology	<p>Written Paper – 1 hour 15</p> <p>Multiple choice with one extended q from Alternative to Practical Paper – 45 minutes</p> <p>All course will be assessed up to and including Chapter 17 (Inheritance) plus Organisms and their environment.</p>
Chemistry	<p>Multiple Choice Paper (Paper 2) – 45 mins</p> <p>Written Paper (Paper 4) – 1 hour 15 mins</p> <p>Alternative to Practical Paper (Paper 6) – 1 hour</p> <p>The entire course will be assessed except for syllabus sections 4.2 Hydrogen-oxygen <i>Fuel Cells</i>, 8.3 <i>Group VII Properties</i> and 6.3 – <i>Reversible Reactions and Equilibrium</i>.</p>

History	<p>Paper 1 – 1 hour Understanding the modern world AC Russia, 1894–1945: Tsardom and communism (Full Paper)</p> <p>This period study focuses on the development of Russia during a turbulent half century of change. Part one: The end of Tsardom Part two: Lenin's new society Part three: Stalin's USSR</p> <p>Paper 2 – 1 hour Wider World Studies</p> <p>BC Conflict and tension between East and West, 1945–1972 (full paper)</p> <p>Part one: The origins of the Cold War Part two: The development of the Cold War Part three: Transformation of the Cold War</p> <p>Breakdown of topics available in Student Y11 Sharepoint</p>

Drama	<p>Written Examination Paper 1 (2hrs) 0994 Spec.</p> <p>Pre-released study text ‘Dracula’ and Sections A and C.</p> <p>Section A – Eight questions, totalling 30 Marks Section C – Two questions totalling 25 Marks, 10 mark and a 15-mark split.</p> <p>Lessons are now being used for the revision, but students are advised to read the pre-released text to prepare for Section A and to also complete extension homework's set between these lessons based on their devised pieces ready for Section C.</p>
DT	Students will sit a 2-hour mock paper covering the core areas of Design Technology. Key revision material to be used should be their “my revision notes” book as well as Seneca. For detailed information on areas to revise please use this link: GCSE Revision 2022.docx

(24th and 25th January 2023) This piece of work will be added to your Course Work Unit, which is only Unit you are doing in Art.</p>
