Protecting your child against HPV related cancers

As your child is now in school year 8, they are now due for the HPV vaccination. This vaccine will help protect them against cancers caused by the Human Papillomavirus (HPV).

Vaccine protection against cancer

- Human papillomavirus (HPV) is a common, contagious virus that can cause cancers in both men and women.
- Without vaccination, 90% of adults will have HPV infection at some point in their life. There is no treatment for HPV infection.
- For some people the virus causes no symptoms and goes away by itself, but it can persist and cause types of cancer or serious illness for others.
- Having HPV vaccination helps protect against cervical, vaginal and vulval cancers in females, throat
 and anal cancer in females and males, and penile cancer in males. The vaccine also protects
 against cases of genital warts in both males and females.
- HPV vaccine is most effective when given at age 12/13 years therefore this school programme is only available in school year 8.
- The vaccine has been thoroughly tested and millions of doses have been used around the world.
- This is a one dose programme and nurses will attend the school to give your child the vaccine.
- The vaccine brand name is Gardasil and since its introduction it has reduced the rates of some cancers significantly. - If your child is absent on the day of the vaccination, there will be a catch up clinic held in the hospital
 outpatients department on Wednesday 21st Feb 4-8pm you will receive a separate letter
 confirming this if your child misses the vaccination.
