Communication

We endeavour to keep parents informed of all aspects of school life and you will receive emails from school via SIMS Intouch. If we have an urgent message and need to communicate with parents at short notice you will receive a text alert.

Parents are encouraged to be an active participant in their son's educational journey and throughout the year, staff will actively engage with parents through classroom events.

Our Daily Routine

School Day Arrangements

Our playground is open from 8:15am when it is supervised by a member of staff.

Pupils who are dropped at the College Arch at the bottom of Pleasant Street/Grosvenor Street in the morning must enter school via the brown gate and not the main drive due to traffic.

The playground gates open at 2:45pm for parents of boys in Years 3 and 4 who may wish to park in the playground and collect their child from outside the main school office. Alternatively, boys can be collected from the College Arch. Our caretaker and members of staff are always on duty to supervise and ensure boys are collected safely. Parents collecting on foot should not exit the school premises through the green playground gates.

Registration

Registration is taken twice a day, in the morning and after lunch. If your child is late to school, they will need to sign in at the office. Registration is an important safeguarding requirement to ensure we know where the children are at different points of the day. Please ensure your child understands the importance of registration.



Absence

If your child is unwell, please inform the school office by emailing admin@vcp.sch.je or calling 723468 to report the absence.

Taking children out of school during term time is strongly discouraged. Under exceptional circumstances, a leave of absence will be authorised, but parents must complete and return a leave of absence request form at least 10 days before the intended absence. This form is available on our website and should be submitted online.

If your son has a medical appointment or music exam during school time, please advise the school office by emailing admin@vcp.sch.je. A leave of absence form will not be required.

Pupil Messages

Boys should keep an eye on the Information Screens situated around school - if their name appears here a message will be waiting at the school office for them.

Travel/Walking Bus

If your son catches a bus at the end of the school day, the school office admin@vcp.sch.je should be notified of the route/bus number. Boys will be registered at 3:00pm and together will walk through the College grounds to the JCG car park at 3:15pm with our supervising adult.

Medical Care and Wellbeing

The wellbeing of our boys at VCP is of great importance. We understand that children need help to manage their emotions and to develop resilience and self-confidence.

At VCP we regularly review our first aid policies and procedures to ensure that your son receives the best possible care during their time at school.

Minor bumps and injuries, however small they appear to be, are assessed, treated, and recorded by a qualified first aider.

Medication

If your child needs medication during school hours, i.e., Calpol/antibiotics a consent form should be completed for the period required and submitted online. All clearly labelled medication should be handed into the school office by the parent.

If your son has ongoing daily medication an Individual Healthcare Plan should be shared with the school.

Learning

During your son's time at Prep, they will hear a lot about our 'Core Values'. Together we actively use our core values to guide our daily interactions with one another and our approach to schoolwork.

We aim to help boys discover their special interests and skills which inspire them to love learning and enjoy life. We aim high and celebrate everyone!

We offer a broad and balanced curriculum together with strong extra-curricular activities. This combination provides a well-rounded education and a solid base for their future. Our teaching is focused but also dynamic and imaginative, both inside and beyond the classroom.

As well as having fun, forging friendships, and creating memories, our boys work hard to achieve the high academic standards for which our school is renowned.

VCP aims to nurture respectful, resourceful, and resilient young people and to help them build successful futures. We encourage boys to aspire to excellence in everything they do and make the most of all the opportunities we offer.

Academic Progress

Your son's academic progress is closely monitored throughout his time at VCP, through class work, termly standardised tests in English and maths and teacher judgement. We aspire for all boys to be working at or above Age Related Expectation. Verbal parent and teacher consultations are held in the Autumn and Spring terms culminating in a final end of year written report.

Specialist Subjects

French

French is taught in every year group. The primary aim is to inspire a love for French in all our children at Prep. Boys receive one hour of French each week and lessons are creative and playful in their approach, with a focus on games and role plays.

Pupils are encouraged to listen and repeat, helping them to speak with a clear French accent. They are taught everyday language and cover areas such as personal greetings, numbers, days of the week, colours, clothes and food.

Music

The musical life at VCP is vibrant and filled with lots of fun activities and events and all pupils have a weekly music lesson. Music is a very practical subject and boys in each year group will have the opportunity to experience music in its many forms and genres, whether by playing an instrument, listening, and appraising, composing their own, or performing alongside their friends.

Individual Music Lessons

We offer a huge array of different musical instrument lessons via the Victoria College Music Academy, Jersey Music Services and by our talented peripatetic music teachers. Science

Science is a core subject within our curriculum, harnessing the boys own natural interest in the world around them.

The boys thrive on the practical approach and become adept at planning and carrying out their own investigations. VCP is incredibly well-resourced, and the large, spacious, and well-equipped science laboratory gives the boys the opportunity to complete a wide range of investigations within a stimulating learning environment.

Sport

Sport can help to develop confidence and a positive mental attitude that permeates all aspects of a child's life. Here at VCP we aim to develop a love of sport that will last our boys a lifetime and in offering such a wide range of sports feel confident that we have something for every ability and interest.

We have access to excellent facilities which are utilised in PE and Games lessons throughout the year. We aim to provide the opportunity for pupils to represent the school in competitive fixtures should they wish by the time they have reached Year 6 to experience the team ethos and camaraderie associated with Game situations.



Uniform and Appearance

We take great pride in our appearance, and it is very important that boys are encouraged to maintain the highest possible standards regarding their presentation.

- Hair should be smart, tidy, kept out of the eyes and must not be a distraction to learning. If hair extends beyond the collar, it should be tied back
- Hair length of less than grade 3 is not permitted and neither are shaved lines or patterns in hair
- Top buttons are done up when a tie is worn
- Shirts are always tucked in
- Trainers are not worn with school uniform
- Pupils travel to and from school in full school uniform or full tracksuit

All school uniform and sports kit may be purchased from our uniform supplier, Redvers, who operate from their shop by appointment. Redvers are also able to supply trainers, football boots and a range of school shoes and other necessary items.

Electrical/Digital Items

Digital technology is a crucial part of young people's lives in and out of school and a valuable tool for learning. We are committed to helping our students stay safe online and use technology responsibly.

Each pupil is given an iPad for the duration of their time at VCP, and the Pupil Acceptable Use Policy Agreement will be discussed with boys when they join VCP.

The Acceptable User Policy helps to keep your son and family safe. When your son signs this form, he is agreeing to follow the policy when using any of the school's computers, devices or other IT equipment.

Personal Items

Smart Watches

Smart watches can be worn but boys must not have access to the internet and should not contain images or photos.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones should be handed into the class teacher or stored safely in your son's bag for the duration of the school day. All contact with parents throughout the school day should be made on the school office telephone and not by mobile phone.

Please note that any electronic item brought into school is done so at the owner's risk and Victoria College Preparatory School cannot not be held responsible for the loss of any personal possessions which are left on school premises.

Stationery

We always encourage our pupils to arrive for lessons fully prepared and equipped.

Year 3 & 4: Boys are not required to bring a pencil case to school as all stationery is provided, however please ensure your son has the necessary equipment for homework.

Year 5 & 6: Boys should bring in their own pencil case with basic stationery:

- Handwriting pen of their choice in blue only Frixion pens are permitted
- Selection of colouring pencils/pens/felt tips
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Glue stick

VCP will supply other equipment.

Lost Property

Lost property baskets can be found in the school hall and in the gym. Parents and boys are encouraged to check these baskets on a regular basis. We strongly advise all parents to clearly label all items. Please be mindful of sending any expensive items into the school.

Lost property will be cleared every term and all named items returned to their owner. The remaining unnamed items will be given to the second-hand uniform shop.

Healthy Eating and Snacks

Boys have the option of either bringing a packed lunch or registering for a hot lunch. The provision of hot food at VCP is outsourced to Caring Cooks of Jersey 'Flourish' who work closely with primary schools' island wide to tailor menus to the tastes and preferences of primary aged pupils. The catering team create nutritious, balanced meals.

If your son chooses to bring a packed lunch from home, please make sure it is in a sturdy lunch box and not in a paper or plastic bag. Lunch boxes should be clearly named.

To protect children with severe nut allergies, packed lunches should not contain nuts.

Boys should bring a named reusable bottle of water only.

For breaktime children should bring a healthy 'waste-free' fruit or vegetable snack.

If parents wish to bring a cake or treats into the school to celebrate their son's birthday, it is essential that the treat does not contain nuts.

Our staff offer a variety of clubs each term, catering to a wide range of interests, for which parents are not charged. The variety and quality of the club provision encourage the learning and development of new skills. Boys build positive relationships with staff and often develop friendships with children in other year groups.
