

RBC Race for Kids Jersey 21/9/2025



YEAR 3

The week ahead



In English, the boys will continue their exciting journey with *After the Fall*, focusing on how to use fronted adverbials and conjunctions to enhance their writing. They'll have the chance to retell a nursery rhyme of their choice, applying these new techniques to bring their stories to life.

In Maths, we're building on our understanding of place value. The boys will be working with number lines up to 1000, and exploring how numbers change when we add or subtract 1, 10, or 100. These activities will help deepen their number sense and confidence.

In Computing, we're kicking off our first unit on coding using the Scratch programme. The boys will begin learning how to create simple programs, laying the foundation for logical thinking and digital creativity.

In RE, the boys will continue exploring Judaism, focusing on the question: How do festivals and family life show what matters most to Jews? They'll delve deeper into the traditions of Shabbat and begin learning about Pesach (Passover), discovering how these celebrations reflect Jewish values and beliefs.

We are lucky enough to have some 6th form students from both VCJ and JCG coming into school each week to volunteer in year 3. They may even hear your son read so look out for the special labels that may appear in your son's homework diary!

YEAR 4

The week ahead



Next week, the boys will continue their journey with Leon and the Place Between, focusing on newspaper reports. They'll explore the key features of a newspaper article, learning how to report on the exciting events that unfolded when Leon visited the circus. By the end of the week, they'll be ready to include all the essential elements to write their own reports on the action!

In Maths, the boys will continue their exploration of place value, deepening their understanding of how the value of a number is determined by its position. For example, in the number 4,563, the 4 represents 4 thousands, the 5 represents 5 hundreds, and so on. They'll practice partitioning numbers into their individual place value parts and explore how to find 10, 100, and 1,000 more or less than four-digit numbers.

On Monday, the boys will attend an E-Safety presentation at JCG, where they'll learn about how technology captures their attention and affects their emotions on platforms like social media and YouTube. They'll also explore building healthy digital habits, including managing notifications, screentime, and curating their feeds, as well as the importance of device-free moments for better sleep and well-being.







YEAR 6

The week ahead



This week, we have continued to read our Watertower book, focussing upon inference and vocabulary. The boys are thoroughly enjoying this mystery and relating to the different characters feelings and emotions. In Maths, we have continued with our place value work, building upon these skills to look at ordering and rounding numbers. We have also started our class reading books, together with the start of our Picasso Topic in Art.

Next week, the boys will continue their exciting reading adventure, The Watertower, deepening their learning by looking at the grammar techniques used. The boys will also become reading detectives and use clues from the text to work out how the characters are feeling and what they might be thinking. It promises to be a wonderful week of imagination, curiosity, and discovery!

In maths, the boys will continue building their skills in our first unit on place value together with starting our second unit focussing on adding and subtracting integers. We will also continue with our English reading work focussing upon vocabulary and prediction. This will allow the children to delve deeper into their learning and predict what might happen in the following chapters and where they support these ideas from.
