Maths fluency is fundamental. In class, your son will complete 5 fluency-based questions each day. A copy of this fluency sheet will be sent home at the end of the following week for your son to complete as his **maths homework**. This is to consolidate their prior learning and to build confidence and pace.

Please ensure this is handed in **every Friday** where they will be checked by the class teacher.

It would be beneficial to supplement this with other fluency-based games. At VCP the boys also have access to 'Times Tables Rockstars', 'Hit the Button', 'Power Maths' and other Maths applications and games.



Pupils will use this in school, but we encourage regular practise at home to develop their mathematical fluency and accuracy.

The boys ***should*** confidently already know their 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 times tables.

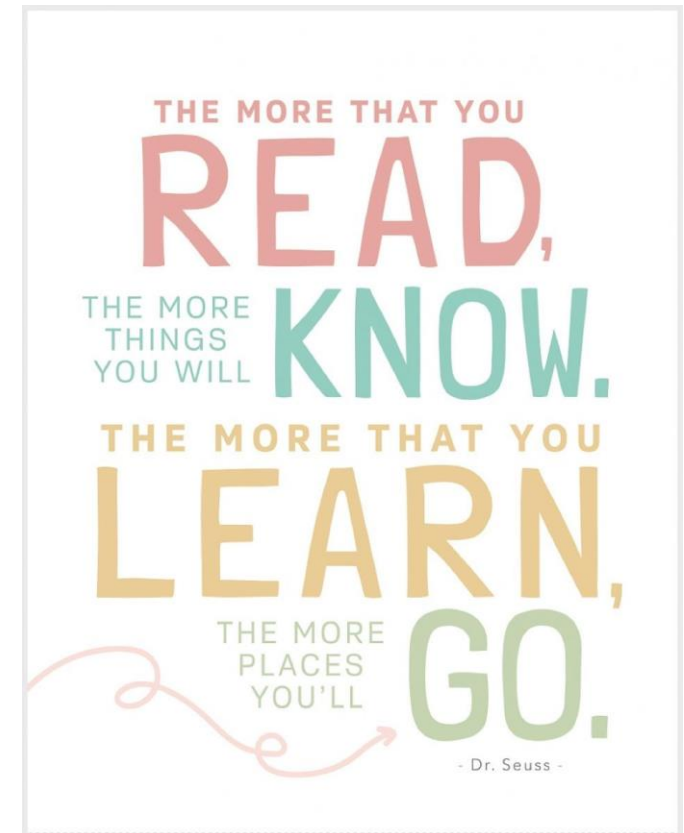

WHERE CAN I FIND THESE BOOKS?

There is a box located in every year group and the Science classroom with many of the books on the challenge sheets, there are also some in the school library and even in the class libraries. I'VE ALREADY READ THIS BOOK!





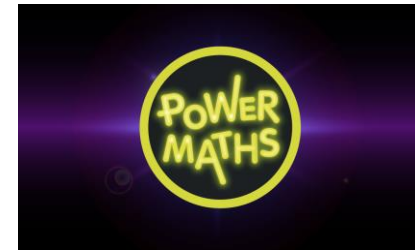

Homework

Reading- Minimum of 10 Minutes everyday. Complete Reading Record/Homework Diary daily with the name of the book and how many pages read. You may wish to include a comment. Promote independence when books need changing.

Maths- Maths Fluency Sheet sent out each Friday and handed in following Friday.

Practise numbers bonds as well as addition and subtraction facts. Practice times tables.

All pupils should enter Year 3 knowing their 2, 5 and 10 x tables fluently. They will need to learn their 3, 4 and 8 times tables by the end of Year 3.

Spellings- Weekly spellings sent out each Friday. Practise with Look Say Cover Think Write Check. Learn the meaning of the words. This will be taught weekly in spelling lesson. Boys will be tested every Friday.

CLASSROOM ROUTINES

Your son will keep his school bag in their own cubby hole and small items in his tray below his desk. Blazers may go on the back of their chair in the classroom.

If something goes missing there are lost property containers in the Year group shared area, drama studio and gym so please ask your son to check there in the first instance.

If your son finds it difficult to remember his equipment, we suggest that you help him to remember what he needs each day by drawing up a simple checklist with him and putting it in a visible place at home.

Next Week's learning

Next week in Maths, the boys will continue their unit on Time. They will be learning to convert between different units of time, including seconds to minutes and minutes to hours. They will also practise reading and telling the time on both analogue and digital clocks, as well as converting between the two formats. A great interactive resource to support this learning is the MathsFrame Telling the Time game.

In English, the boys will continue their learning journey on The Big Blue Whale. They will further develop their understanding of key vocabulary related to the topic. The boys will also revisit the use of adverbial phrases and practise extending sentences using conjunctions. This work will help prepare them for their upcoming writing task, where they will create their own voiceover script for a documentary.

POWER MATHS

A MASTERY APPROACH TO TEACHING MATHEMATICS

Mastering maths means acquiring a deep, long-term, secure and adaptable understanding of the subject rather than rote memorisation of procedures.

At the heart of Power Maths is the belief that all children can achieve. It's built on an exciting growth mindset and problem-solving approach.

Lesson structure:

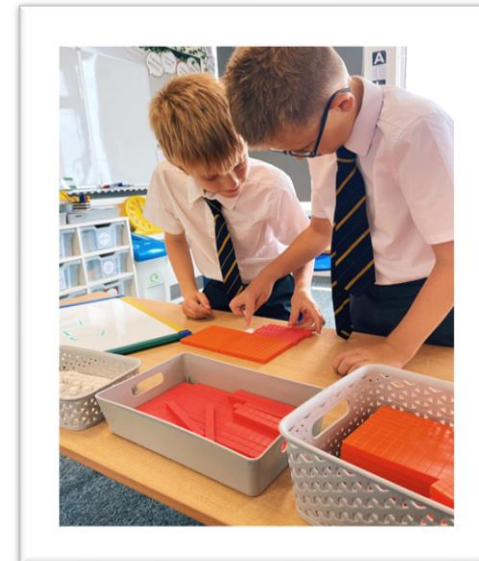
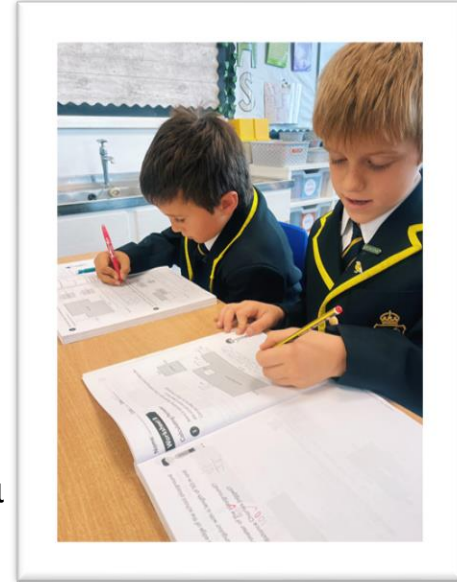
Discover – each lesson begins with a problem to solve, often a real-life example, sometimes a puzzle or a game. These are engaging and fun, and designed to get all children thinking.

Share – the class shares their ideas and compares different ways to solve the problem, explaining their reasoning with hands-on resources and drawings to make their ideas clear. Children are able to develop their understanding of the concept with input from the teacher.

Think together – the next part of the lesson is a journey through the concept, digging deeper and deeper so that each child builds on secure foundations while being challenged to apply their understanding in different ways and with increasing independence.

Practice – now children practice individually or in small groups, rehearsing and developing their skills to build fluency, understanding of the concept and confidence.

Reflect – finally, children are prompted to reflect on and record their learning from each session and show how they have grasped the concept explored in the lesson.

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ORACY AT VCP

Oracy involves expressing ideas, deepening understanding, and connecting with others through speaking, listening, and communication.

At VCP we recognise oracy is central to learning: purposeful talk is planned deliberately. There are a range of opportunities for all pupils (regardless of educational needs) to receive a high-quality oracy education where scaffolds and structures support and challenge students. The culture of listening ensures that all voices are heard and valued. We know our pupils are confident speakers, but our aim is for students to use social oracy skills to collaborate with others: communication is a life skill. Our pupils leave VCP with the oracy tools needed for success beyond the school grounds.

Keep an eye out for our **'What's New? What's Next?'** questions, shared every Thursday in the weekly reminders. These prompts are a great way to spark meaningful conversations with your son about what he's learning at school.




